SYNCHRONIZING THE HOLY BIBLE (KJV), JASHER, JUBILEES AND ENOCH OUTLINE OF EVENTS IN CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER From Adam through to Noah By Maralyn B. Dyck

Gen. 6:1-2 Man began to multiply upon the earth; daughters were born to them.

- The sons of God saw that the daughters of men were fair.
- They took wives they wanted with no regard to the fact that some were already married.

Enoch 6:3-8 Semjaza, their leader, convinced 199 more Watchers to agree to go with him and took wives, as they chose, from the men of the earth.

- He promised that only he would bare the punishment for this great sin.
- They agreed to swear an oath and bind themselves together to plan and do this thing.
- There were 200 watchers who descended to earth on the summit of Mount Herman in the days of Jared.
- The names of the leaders were: Arakiba, Rameel, Kokabiel, Tamiel, Ramiel, Danel, Ezequeel, Baraqijal, Ananel, Zaquiel, Samsapeel, Sararel, Turel, Jomjael, Sariel.
- Enoch 7:1-6 When the Watchers descended and took wives of their choice they began to go in to them and defiled them, and the women gave birth to children; they were great giants, with heights up to 30 feet tall.
 - They taught charms and enchantments, and the cutting of roots, and made them acquainted with plants.
 - -These giants quickly consumed all the acquisitions of men for themselves. When the men could no longer defend themselves, they turned on them devoured them. They were cannibals!
 - It did not end there; they began to sin against birds, beasts, reptiles and fish, and then they turned against each other and devoured their flesh and drank their blood.
 - Then the earth laid accusations against the lawless ones.

Enoch 7:21-23 - Noah's Recap: The Watchers of the earth allowed these things to

happen, so God caused the flood upon the earth as their first punishment.

- Their children became known as the Nephilim, and they were all unalike, and they devoured one another.
- The giants started killing the Nephilim (their children), while the Nephilim were killing the Eljos, and the Eljos started killing the remaining men, while at the same time the men were also fixated on killing each other. Every one sold himself to work iniquity and to a lot of shed blood, and the earth was filled with iniquity.

Enoch 9:1-11 Then Michael, Uriel, Raphael, and Gabriel (archangels of God) looked down from heaven and saw the shedding of blood on the earth and the lawlessness throughout the whole land.

- And they said to one another, "The people of the earth are crying out to the gates of heaven for help!"
- They reported these things to the Lord of Lords, all these things that were happening. They said, "You see all these things that are going on and how evil the Watchers are becoming. Yet you are allowing these things and have not given us any instructions to interfere in the situation."

Enoch 10:1-12 Then the Great One spoke. His first instructions were for Uriel.

- Go to Noah and tell him in My Name to hide himself, then reveal to him the about the end that is approaching, that the whole earth will be destroyed, and a deluge is about to come upon the whole earth and will destroy all that is on it!
- Also tell him that he will escape and his seed will be preserved for all the generations of the world.
- His next instructions were for **Raphael:** "Bind Azazel hand and foot, and cast him into the darkness and make an opening in the desert, which is in Dudael, and cast him therein.
- Place rough and jagged rocks over him and cover him with darkness and let him abide there forever, and cover his face that he may not see light.
- On the day of great judgment he shall be cast into the lake of fire.
- Heal the earth which the angels have corrupted, and proclaim the healing of the earth, that they may heal the plague, and that all the children of men may not perish through all the secret things that the Watchers have disclosed and have taught their sons.

- The whole earth has become destroyed through the works that were taught by Azazel: to him ascribe all sin."
- The Lord said to **Gabriel**, "Proceed against the bastards, reprobates and fornicators and send them one against the other that they may destroy each other in battle: for length of days they shall not have."
- No request that they may make of you, regarding their children, shall be granted unto their fathers, for the children are hoping for eternal life. Each of the children will be given 500 years."
- Then the Lord said to Michael: "Now go and bind Semjaza and his associates who have united themselves with women, defiling themselves in their uncleanness.
- When their sons have killed one another and have seen the destruction of their beloved ones, bind them fast for <u>seventy generations</u> in the valleys of the earth, till the day of their judgment and of their consummation, until the judgment that is for ever and ever is consummated."
- Jasher 3:17-38 Adam died during the 243rd reign of Enoch. Enoch resolved to separate himself from the sons of men and to secret himself as he had done before in order to serve the Lord. He secluded himself for 3 days, then appeared to them for one day. He continued this pattern for many years.
- When he was alone he spent his time praying to and praising the Lord his God. On the days he spent with the people he taught them the ways of the Lord, answering all their questions about the Lord.
- He finally began to stay in seclusion for six days at a time, appearing only for the seventh day. After a few years it was once a month, then once a year, until all the people began to search for him, desiring to see his face again but could never find where he was hiding.
- The people loved him but they also feared him because of a Godlike awe that was seated upon his face. (Remember Moses when he spent 40 days on the mountain with God...his face shone!)
- When the day came for Enoch to spend time with them, they assembled themselves and came to him. Once again he taught them wisdom and knowledge. They bowed down before him and said, 'May the king live!'
- Sometime later, when Enoch was just finished teaching them, an angel of the Lord spoke to him wishing to bring him up to teach the Sons of God as he was teaching the sons of man.

- He assembled all the people together and again taught them, but at the end he told them that God was going to take him to heaven. He did not know when but it would be soon.
- One day when Enoch was again teaching them, the people looked up and saw a likeness of a great horse descend from heaven and paced in the air. Enoch said to them that it was on his account that the horse was there and the time had come for him to leave them for ever, never to see them again on earth.
- The horse then came down and stood before Enoch before the eyes of all his people, and they saw it. He taught them some last minute things, then mounted upon the horse.
- Enoch slowly rode forth and all the people followed him, about 800,000 men. He said to them, "Men, return to your tents. By staying with me you may die." Some turned back and went home. The rest of them followed him for six more days.
- More men finally went home, but some of the men were hanging onto him and begging him to let them stay with him until he ascended into heaven. He warned them again that they might die if they saw that event. They stayed with him anyways.
- Enoch ceased speaking with them about leaving and let them continue to follow him.
- When the kings and their followers returned home, they took a census to find out how many men stayed the last time. On the seventh day Enoch ascended into heaven in a whirlwind with horses and chariots of fire.
- The kings decided to go back to find the place where Enoch ascended into heaven. It was easy to find; the area was filled with large stones of snow! They decided to break through the snow and see if they could find Enoch or the men that were with him, but Enoch and the men were never found. They assumed the men were dead and Enoch was gone. They were not inside the stones of snow.
- Enoch 12:1-6 Earlier, Enoch was hidden; where he abode when not with the people or what had become of him each time he was gone from them.
- His activities had to do with the Watchers, and his days were with the holy ones. The Watchers called him Enoch the Scribe.
- God gave Enoch a mission, a message for the evil Watchers who left heaven and caused so much destruction. The message told them that they would have no forgiveness of sin.
- They shall see the murder of their children and shall make supplication unto eternity,

but they will not receive mercy or peace.

Enoch 13 Enoch - Enoch delivers all God's message to the Watchers.

- When they heard God's judgment, they all were afraid, fear and trembling seized them.
- They begged Enoch to speak with God for now they could not speak to Him or raise their eyes to heaven for shame for their sins for which they had been condemned.
- He wrote their petition and then took it and sat down by the waters of Dan and read it to God, and he fell asleep.
- Enoch 14 A dream came to him with God's answer, a vision of chastisements and a message to Enoch to chastise them and reprimand them for even thinking God would change His mind.
- When he awoke, he returned to where the Watchers were waiting for him, weeping, with their faces covered.
- Enoch gave them God's message and reprimanded them as God had commanded him.
- Enoch 15 More of the vision is presented. God emphasized that the Watchers were formerly spiritual, living the eternal life, and immortal for all generations of the world.
- He did not appoint wives for them in heaven because heaven is their dwelling place, not on the earth.
- Their children, the giants, are produced from the spirits and the flesh; they shall be called evil spirits upon the earth, and on the earth shall be their dwelling once their bodies no longer exist.
- For the spirits in heaven; in heaven shall be their dwelling, but the spirits of the earth, on the earth shall be their dwelling.
- The spirits of the giants afflict, oppress, destroy, attack, do battle, work destruction, and cause trouble.
- They need no food, nevertheless they hunger and thirst, causing offenses. These spirits shall rise up against the children of men and against the women, because they proceeded from them.
- Enoch 16 From the day they leave their human bodies the spirits go forth without incurring judgment until God's final Day of Judgment at the end of time.

- There will be no forgiveness of sins for them, nor any peace...the same judgment as their parents.

Jasher 7:1 And all the days of Enoch were 365 years.

Genesis 5 And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him.

- Jasher 4 When Enoch had ascended into heaven, the kings of the earth took
 Methuselah his son and anointed him, making him king over them all in place of
 Enoch his father.
- And Methuselah acted uprightly in the sight of God. During his whole life he taught the sons of men wisdom, knowledge and the fear of God and he told them not to turn from the good way either to the left or to the right.
- In the latter days of Methuselah, men turned from the Lord and corrupted the earth; they robbed and plundered each other and rebelled against God. They transgressed and corrupted their ways and would not hearken to the voice of Methuselah, but rebelled against him.
- The Lord was exceedingly wroth with them and he continued to destroy the seed in those days, thorns and thistles were produced which they did not sow.
- Still the sons of men did not turn from their evil ways, provoking the Lord. The Lord was very angry and was sorry he had made man.
- He decided to destroy them and annihilate them, and He did so.
- During those days Seth the son of Adam, died.
- Lamech, Methusalah's son, married Ashmua and she conceived a son, Noah.
- For a short while the earth around Noah was at rest and free from corruption. Noah followed the ways of his father Methusaleh, perfect and upright.
- It did not take long before men again turned from God as they multiplied upon the earth.
- The earth became corrupted once more, filled with violence and evil of every kind.
- Man made himself into a god, robbing and plundering his neighbors, as well as his relatives.
- Their judges and rulers also became corrupt. They abused the cattle and animals of

the earth and taught the mixture of animals of one species with another in order to provoke the Lord.

- God saw the whole earth and its corrupted ways, both of men and animals.
- Genesis 6 The Lord says, "My spirit shall not always strive with man; yet his days will be 120 yrs."
- There were giants in those days and also after that. The sons of God came unto the daughters of men. Some of their children became the mighty men of old, men of renown.
- God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and man was evil continually.
- The Lord repented that he had made man on the earth; it grieved Him at His heart.
- Jasher 4 God said that He would blot out man, the birds of the air, together with the beasts of the field, for He repented that He had made them.
- <u>All</u> the men <u>who walked in the ways of the Lord died</u> in those days, <u>before</u> the Lord brought the evil upon the earth.
- This was from the Lord, as He declared that they should not see the evil which the Lord spoke of concerning the sons of men.
- Genesis 6:7-22 Noah was a just man who found grace in the eyes of the Lord. He was perfect in his generations and Noah walked with God.
- Noah's wife gave birth to three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth
- God told Noah He was going to destroy the earth because of all the evil, except for himself and his family.
- God gave Noah the instructions to build an ark, a large one, for his family and all the animals, birds and beasts of the field. He gave him the plans.
- Besides his family, he said to bring every living thing of all flesh, two of every kind, into the ark with him; also two of the fowls after their kind and cattle of their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after their kind. They would come to him to keep them alive. (I think the angels would be guiding them to the ark when the time was right. Just my own conclusion.)
- Noah was also instructed to gather food for himself and his family, and all the different living beings and place it into the ark. Noah did all that God commanded

him to do.

Genesis 7:1-10 God gave Noah further instructions.

- Of every clean beast and all the fowls of the air should be by sevens, male and female, to keep the seed alive upon the face of all the earth.
- God said the rains would begin in seven days and would rain steadily for forty days and nights. Every living thing that he had created would be destroyed from off the face of the earth.
- Noah did as God commanded him to do. He was 600 years old when the flood waters were upon the earth.
- Noah and his family entered in the ark to wait for the rains to begin.
- Then the animals, both clean and unclean and fowls came into the ark two by two and the clean ones were seven in number.
- At the end of the seven days, the waters of the flood began upon the earth.
- Jasher 6:1-26 Godtold Noah and his family to enter the ark. God said he would surround the ark with all the animals of the earth, the beasts of the field and the fowls of the air.
- Noah was instructed to sit in front of the ark. Those who come before him that kneel down will be the ones to go into the ark. His sons would take them in to their respective places in the ark. All the others standing before you must be left behind.
- He had one dilemma. A mother lion with her two cubs, a male and female, knelt before Him...three of them. She obviously wanted to stay with them. Suddenly, the two whelps rose up and chased their mother away and came back and knelt before him.
- Noah saw this with great wonder. They were taken into the ark while the mother and all the others watched.
- Two by two the unclean animals, beasts and fowl arrived at the ark; the clean ones entered in their sevens as God had commanded. They surrounded the ark at every place to give Noah seven days to get them all into the ark in the places that were prepared for them. And God shut the door.
- Still, even with all the warning of the rain and activities happening during those seven days the sons of man did not return from their evil ways, but chose to die in their sins, lost forever.

- As the rains began to fall in sheets and the water started coming up from the ground, the people who had heard Noah's warning, hurried out to the ark to get inside, but the doors were shut, for God had closed the door.
- They called out to Noah to let them in, but he told them they had their opportunity and chose to worship Satan and not God. He said he could not open the door even if he wanted to do so.
- Other animals of all kinds milled around the ark hoping to get inside or on top and somehow escape the water that was rapidly beginning to cover the ground.
- He again preached to the people about the need to turn back to God from inside the ark, but none wanted to turn from their evil ways. There were about 707,000 people gathered, trying to get into the ark. Of course the ark could not hold them even if Noah wanted them inside with him.
- They told Noah that they were ready to return to the Lord, but God knew their real hearts were not for Him, but only to escape the flood.
- The crowds then approached the ark with the purpose of actually breaking their way into the ark. The waters were not that deep yet where the ark was sitting.
- The Lord commanded all the other beasts that were surrounding the ark to attack the people and drive them away from the ark and they obeyed.
- The people all ran away from the animals and started heading for higher ground in order to escape the flood waters, and the animals, hoping to get above the flood waters followed them. They scattered in every direction. However, it was all in vain.
- At the end of seven days the rain began to fall; the whole earth began to shake, the sun darkened, and the foundations of the world raged; the whole earth was moved violently, the lightening flashed, and the thunder roared.
- The ark floated upon the face of waters and it was tossed viciously upon the waters so that all the living creatures within were turned about like pottage in a cauldron.
- And great anxiety seized all the living creatures that were in the ark, and the ark was like to be broken.
- All the living creatures that were in the ark were terrified, and the lions roared, and every living creature in the ark spoke and lamented in its own language, so that their voices reached to a great distance, and Noah and his sons cried and wept in their troubles; they were greatly afraid that they had reached the gates of death.

- Noah prayed unto the Lord on account of this, "O Lord help us, for we have no strength to bear this evil that has encompassed us, for the waves of the waters have surrounded us, mischievous torrents have terrified us, O Lord, answer us, light up thy countenance towards us and be gracious to us, redeem us and deliver us.
- The Lord hearkened to the voice of Noah, and the Lord remembered him.
- By the end of the 40 days of rain and all the shaking and breaking up of the earth, the water covered the entire world. God kept the ark and its contents protected even during raging waters and upheavals of the earth. Every living thing on the earth died.
- All the foundations in the earth were broken up, such as was not known to the inhabitants before, and God did this mighty act in order to terrify the sons of men, that there might be no more evil upon earth.
- And a wind passed over the earth, the waters were still and the ark rested.
- The waters decreased and the ark rested upon the mountains of Aarat.
- Noah opened the window and called out to God asking Him to release them all from the confinement of the ark for he was wearied with much sighing.
- The Lord answered Noah. You shall leave the ark after you have completed a full year in the ark; then you all can leave it.
- By the end of the year the waters were dried off from the earth and Noah put off the covering of the ark.
- However, they could not all leave the ark until God told them to do so. Finally, the day came when Noah was told that they could leave the ark.
- They all gradually went their own way, including all the living animals, fowl and creatures that were aboard the ark.
- They served the Lord all **their days**. God blessed them and commanded them to become strong and increase abundantly throughout the land.
- Genesis 7:1-23 The same day that God shut the door, the waters of heaven were opened and the fountains of the great deep were broken up. Noah was 600 years old.
- The rain was upon the earth for forty days and forty nights. When the waters had risen high enough, the ark was lifted up above the earth and began to float.

- The water stopped rising when the ark was fifteen cubits above the highest point of land; all the earth was covered.
- Every living thing or person on the earth died, none survived, except for all those in the ark, which God kept safe during all the commotion.
- The waters prevailed upon the earth for 150 days. The sons of men still did not turn from their wicked ways and continued to rebel against God.
- Genesis 8:1-13 The sons of men still did not turn from their wicked ways and continued to rebel against God, until they all died because of the flood. (Some of possibly possibly kept climbing the mountains until they were completely covered over with water from the flood and then died.)
- God made a wind to pass over the earth and the waters began to lower. The fountains of the deep and the windows of heaven were stopped.
- The waters returned from off the earth continually.
- The ark rested upon the <u>mountains</u> of Aararat in the seventh month. For three months more the water kept retreating.
- Forty days later Noah opened the window of the ark and sent forth a raven which went back and forth from the ark without finding another place to land.
- Finally, he sent forth a dove to see if the waters had abated from around the ark. She returned without finding a place to rest.
- After waiting seven more days he once again sent the dove from the ark. She returned in the evening with an olive leaf, a sprig, in her mouth.
- Noah waited seven more days and sent her out once more. This time the dove did not return.
- During the 601st year of his life Noah opened the covering of the ark which he had made, and he saw that the water had subsided from the face of the earth.
- In the second month the earth was dried. On the 27th day of the month, God told Noah to come out of the ark with his family and all of the living things on the ark.
- They did so.
- Once everyone was off the ark Noah built an altar; taking one of all the clean beasts and of all the clean birds, he offered a whole burnt-offering to the Lord.

- God smelled the sweetness, and after further consideration, He said, "I will no longer curse the earth for the evil deeds of evil men, neither will I curse every living thing on the earth, as I have done. (He will not use a flood over the whole earth again. This does not mean that He will never punish them in the future, when God's <u>final judgment</u> takes place.)

Jubilees 6:1, 3 Noah built an altar on the mountain where the ark rested.

- He placed the fat of an ox, a goat, a sheep and kids, salt, a turtle-dove, a young dove, placing a burnt sacrifice on the altar. He mixed all the above fats with oil, sprinkled with wine over it and strewed frankingense over the top of everything.
- The Lord smelled the goodly savour and blessed them.
- This outline will begin with the covenant between God and Noah and continue from this point up through Abraham and his sons in the next article. I will make a "story" format of this one first.
- I may write another article later on with the visions of Enoch, the parables of Enoch and his journeys that he took when visiting heaven during the time he was teaching the "sons of God," the lessons he taught to his people on earth.
